This edition of the book *Gorin no Sho* (五輪書) has highlighted the collaboration with Professor Teruo Machida from Nippon Sport Science University, Tokyo. Teruo Machida Sensei is a practitioner of Kendo, holding the rank of Kyōshi 7 Dan, and a student of the Niten Ichi-Ryū sword school, specifically the Noda-Ha branch. His master is Eiki Ichikawa, Kendo Kyōshi 7 Dan, the son of Ichikawa Kakuji Sensei .

He kindly provided us with the list of successors of this branch, beginning with Miyamoto Musashi and ending with Ichikawa Kaku-ji Sensei (一川格治先生), the 17th successor of the Noda-Ha school.

After Kakuji ICHIKAWA, the 17th legitimated successor of the Noda-ha, there is no particular successor as an individual; the position has been taken over by the Kendo Federation of Kumamoto Prefecture.

一川英機先生は、第十七代以降二天一流を正式に継承する熊本県剣 道連盟から「達士」の称号を授与され、現在は二天一流杉並会の師範とし て、流儀の存続に寄与している。

Eiki Ichikawa Sensei received the title of "Tasshi" from the Kumamoto Prefectural Kendo Federation, officially certifying the Niten Ichi-ryū style of the 17th generation. Currently, he contributes to the continuation of the style as a Niten Ichi-ryū professor at the Suginamikai association. "Tasshi" is the highest honorary title in the Niten Ichi-ryū (Noda-ha) school.

There are only three Tasshi in Japan. The other two individuals are Ichikawa Hajime and Kitazono Yuichi (both residing in Kumamoto). The first is the younger brother of Ichikawa Eiki Sensei, a Kendo Kyōshi 8 Dan. The latter is the former director of the Kumamoto Martial Arts Gym, holding the rank of Kendo Kyōshi 7 Dan.
